Our clients, their families and the LA have access to the care control portal, they can view what time the staff attend, the location of the staff when they check-in and the tasks the staff do.

Its important that you all understand the importance of being punctual and checking in on time – it is not in place to track your hours and deduct any wages from you – we understand that public transport and/or any other issues cause you to be late & when this is communicated, everything works better. It is a safeguarding measure that we have taken and it also reassures our clients, their familes and the LA that we do monitor our staff punctuality & attendance.
